Students take a state standardized test (GMAS) at the end of the school year to measure how well they have learned the knowledge and skills outlined in the social studies state content standards.

- o In this class, learning is the goal. Students learn in different ways, at different paces, and have different life experiences that impact their learning. As a result, grades don't accurately represent learning and can actually have negative effects on students. Research has proven this. So while I'm required to enter grades in the gradebook, those scores are never permanent. Students always have the opportunity to revise, resubmit, and show growth to improve.
- o <u>Infinite Campus</u> is the district's online gradebook. It's the system used to document the grades I am required to input. However, students play a big role in determining their grades. Students will conference with me to review the work completed, progress made toward the standards, and together we determine what grade bests represents their learning.
- Canvas is the district's learning management system. Besides being in the classroom, Canvas in the best place to "see" student learning and progress. Canvas has instructions for each week, assignments, quizzes, tests, reflections, study materials, etc. This is also where I provide feedback on student work. Students are required to act on the feedback to revise and resubmit assignments, quizzes, and tests in order to show improvement and progress towards the standards.
- **Infinite Campus documents grades. Canvas shows the actual work students are doing. Use both platforms to get a full picture of student progress.

Communication

- <u>Canvas</u> is the learning management system used in our school district. I use Canvas for EVERYTHING: announcements, assignments, quizzes, grades, messaging, calendar, etc.
 - Download the Canvas Parent app. This <u>video</u> walks you through how to set it up.

• Interactive Student Notebooks (ISNs)

The ISN is a student-created journal where all the learning for the year is documented. It is <u>essential</u> to student success in this course. Please invest in <u>a high-quality notebook</u> so it will last all year long.

- I enjoy school most when all of my students are present, engaged and learning! But if you have to be out for any reason, please go to <u>Canvas</u> and do the following:
 - Check Canvas announcements and do the weekly check-in
 - Go to modules and review the weekly learning schedule
 - Seek help and support from your teachers and/or peers if you are unclear of what you missed
- o Parents, if you aren't monitoring your student in Canvas, you can also check the class website.

• Home Learning

- O Students will not have much homework because we do most of the work in class. They are expected to study regularly at home using their ISN, the gallopade workbook, and the study links in Canvas.
- o Any unfinished classwork should be completed before class the next day, or students risk falling behind.
- I also encourage students, where possible, to engage in "real-life" social studies. Examples include:
 - Read/ watch the news, exploring multiple sources to consider different viewpoints
 - Tour local and state historical sites and museums
 - Speak with business owners about their impact on the local economy
 - Voting with your parents
 - Attend civic gatherings and hear elected officials speak
 - Take nature walks and explore the natural geography of our area
 - Notice population patterns and the layout of urban and rural places as you travel
